5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

Dear Mr. Propaler:

On November 29th, in company with County Superintendent Kerstehn, I visited your school. I have the following report to make, which I hope will serve as a guide to further improvement.

You have a good brick building with a gymnasium. May I call attention to the fact, however, that the floors are dark with oil. It is to be hoped that in the near future, these floors can be sanded and treated with a good penetrating seal. I was pleased to note that you have a new furnace, which takes care of your heating problem adequately. According to the report you are not levying a building tax, in spite of the fact there are several definite needs along this line. May I suggest that you levy an adequate building fund and provide definitely for the following:

- 1. Redecoration of the interior.
- 2. Better artificial lighting.
- 3. Good toilets with separate approaches to these toilets.

The folding type of shades for the windows which you now have is a very unsatisfactory kind. When these are replaced, be sure to get the double roller type.

In general your educational equipment is tharly good. However, you are definitely in need of bulletin board and tack strip in each room and extra sets of supplementary readers. At the time of my visit, it was reported these readers had been ordered. I was pleased to note the new geography maps. I wish to compliment the school for providing a nine month term.

In view of the fact that this is a district receiving special aid from the state and that you have a very low enrollment, in all probability it will be financially impossible for you to continue with three teachers. This school was recognized last year and some slight improvements have been made since that time; however, there are still some very definite deficiencies as mentioned in this letter. I am recommending to the Wielend that a Certificate of Recognition for the school year 1935-40 be issued with the definite understanding action will be taken by the board to remove these deficiencies. If it is financially

impossible to correct all of them in one year, the board should map out a definite program of improvement for each year so that within two or three years the recommendations can be completed.

I am enclosing a copy of our mimeographed recommendations with regard to artificial lighting.

Based on an inspection of the sanitary feeilities at Chesterfield Grade Behool. District 122, Verentin County, and Despiter 31, 1941 we conclude that the following semitary date to onlat:

- so the all is sargers to contamination by:
 - (A) Shallow ground waser seepage which may enter through cracks that can develop in the brick well lining; by rain, waste pumpage, dust, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well through cracks in and around the boards which support the pump; by contaminated wastepumper wich will saturate the ground surrounding the well and which may remoter it.
- b. The privies are unsanitary as the pits are accessible to flies, insects, and rodens because of:
 - (A) The open cracks in the waults around the bases of the buildings, the unscreened vents; and the absence of seat covers. The pits were apparently in need of cleaning at time of inspection. Also the urinal was clegged.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present wall lining to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are given on pages 11 to 14 of the bulletin being sent to you today under separate cover.
- 2. Replace the well platform with a 4 inch concrete slab extending beyond the walls at least one foot in all directions. A short iron pipe sleeve, whose diameter will allow the passage of the pump cylinder, should be placed in

CONCERNING THIS SANITARY ANALYSIS

The statements on the reverse side are based not only on the analytical results, but also on the description of the source as furnished by you or already on file in this office. It is further recommended as follows:

- (a) If the water is unsafe to drink, abandon the supply for one of known safety or bring the water to a boil before use, until the suggested improvements have made the supply safe.
 - (b) If the source is not satisfactory, make the suggested improvements immediately.
 - (c) If the water is safe, take care to keep it safe by protecting the supply against contamination.

A laboratory examination of the water has been made to show the presence or absence of waste matter of human or animal origin. If the water is contaminated by surface wash or sewage, then parasitic intestinal worms, amebic cysts or germs of intestinal diseases. such as cause bowel complaint, diarrhea, dysentery or typhoid fever, may be present in the water, thus endangering the health of persons drinking the water. The analytical terms and results are briefly explained as follows:

Physical and Chemical Tests: "Sediment" through "Chloride." A desirable water has an attractive appearance (no sediment or turbidity) and has no objectionable odor or taste. Chemical results are given in parts per million (ppm).

Bacteriological Tests: "Bacteria per ml." indicates the number of microorganisms present in one milliliter (ml.) of water (20 drops) and the number which grew in standard nutrient agar at body temperature (37°C or 98.6°F). These bacteria may not be of intestinal origin and therefore may not be of sanitary importance. Occasionally the test plates are overcrowded so that no bacterial count can be obtained. In such a case the report shows "Innumerable" indicating more than 10,000 bacteria per ml.

"Coli-type bacteria" "Presumptive Tests" "Confirmatory Tests": A water containing bacteria of intestinal origin (E. coli and A. aerogenes, also known as "coliform" bacteria), if placed in a sugar broth (lactose), will cause fermentation and production of gas in 24 or 48 hrs. By means of further laboratory tests the presence of these bacteria in 10 ml. portions is indicated by a +, their absence by a—. The numeral preceding the sign shows the number of portions giving that result.

Example: 2+3— indicates that two 10 ml. portions of the sample did show and three portions did not show coli-type bacteria present.

After receipt of the sample in the laboratory it requires from two to six days to complete the sanitary or bacteriological analysis.

A sample of water was collected from the well after the improvements had been made and an analysis of this water should it to be safe for crinking at the time of collection. This was previously reported to you.

he wish to commend you upon your action in having improvements made to your school water supply. This well should continue to furnish a safe water supply as long as it remains in its present condition.

It is suggested that samples of water be collected from the well occasionally for analysis as a check upon the condition of the water. Lattle containers will be forwarded for this purpose upon request.

the platform at the time of construction. Sleeve should extend about one inch into the pump base. The pump should rest directly on the concrete and be firmly belted in place. If a manhole is desired it should be constructed as shown in Fig. 5 of the well bulletin.

- 32 Disinfect the well water after the above improvements has been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for disinfection is described on pages 23-25 of the well bulletin.
- 4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to earry waste pumpage away from the immediate vicinity of the well.
- 5. Clean out the privy pits and dispose of contents by burning or burying if they are in need of cleaning.
- 6. Seal the open cracks in the waults so that they will be fly-tight.
- 7. Provide the privies with hinged, self-closing seat covers. These covers, when closed, should fit so as to exclude flies.
- 8. Screen the vents with 16 mesh copper screen wire to provent the entrance of flies.

Since the school efficials were responsible for the protection of the health of the pupils while they are at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fullfilled.

If you do not clearly understand the above recommendations or you wish to use equivalent methods for conrecting the existing defects please contact this office. A few minutes spont discussing the matter will clear up any difficulties and will avoid any costly mistakes. We shall appreciate an acknowledgment of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.
