The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to

the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just *finished*.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. · Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.

#### Gentlemen:

On November 2 I visited the Rickmeyer School, District 128. Your teacher, Miss Helen Johnson, is a beginning teacher and does not have any college work. However, my chaerentions were that she will make an excellent teacher. The boys and girls seem to be quite attentive and interested in their work. Miss Johnson is trying hard and I believe is going to give you a good school.

You are to be congratulated upon keeping your school on the recognized list. On the whole, the school is well equipped and serves your community adequately. I might mention that if you have not ordered the Pupils Reading Cirèle Books from the State Reading Circle Board, I kope that you will order them at once, as these books should be ordered every year. They are the cheapest and best books you can buy and by ordering them every year, you keep your library up to date and you use your state aid somey for a purpose which they expect you to use it. You also need a new set of teaps, but it night be wall to wait until the war is over. A duplicator would be useful. Your teacher could help you make a selection, or if you let her order it. I am sure she will be gled to do so. You also need a drinking fountain for use during bad weather. Some paper townls would be a big help and also a few additional shelves in the clockroom and some coat hooks would be helpful. You don't have very many pictures in the schoolroom, so if you have a little extra money some time, it wouldn't hurt to buy a few good pictures of a patriotic nature. The floors are rather dark and have been ciled. A lot of schools have scaded the floors and are varnishing them and them putting wax on them like the front room floor at home. This is a big help, too. Also, when you have the money, it wouldn't hart to paint the inside a light color which will make the building much brighter and cleaner. The scats should be put on boards so that you can nove them around in the room when you clean the building and also when you have a program.

#### Gentlemen;

Based on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Mickeeyer School, District #128, Macoupin County, made July 19, 1939 we conclude that the following sanitary defects exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water seepage which may enter through cracks that can develop in the tile lining; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be washed into the well through cracks in the split-base pump; contaminated waste pumpage everflowing the present inadequate drain and re-entering the well.
- b) The privies are insanitary as they are accessible to flies, insects and rodents because of the open-back type of vaults, the absence of lids, the broken seat in the girl's privy.
  - c) The privies are in poor structural condition.

In order to correct these sanitary defeats at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Four a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 2. Replace the split-base pump with a pump having a one piece circular base, and a stuffing box surrounding the pump rod.
- 3. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to carry waste pumpage away from the immediate wicinity of the well.
- 4. Grout a short iron pipe sleeve into the platform so that the end will extend about one inch into the pump as shown in Fig. 6 of the enclosed bullstin.
- 5. Sterilize the well water after the above improvements have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 6. Seal the open-back on the vaults so that they will be absolutely flytight. This can be done by placing a tight fitting wood cover over the back and then backfilling with earth.

- 7. Provide the priview with binged, solf-glosing like. Those like closed should fit so as to enclude flice.
  - 4. Repair the broken coat in the girl's privy.

In view of the mear condition of the priviou and the number of improvements necessary to make them semitary, we suggest that the Board of Directors consider the installation of the "Samitary Pit" privy. This type of privy has many advantages ever other types of privies, the principal advantage being the prevention of disease by fly transmission.

Since the school efficials are responsible for the protection of the pupils' health while at school, it is important that the above recemmendations be fulfilled.

We shall appreciate an acknowledgment of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.

If the engineers of this department can be of service in connection with your water supply or severage problems, we shall be pleased to be so savised.
