Today your County Superintendent Mr. Wilhite and I visited your school. You have a large school and a teacher who had command of the situation, and who manages your school well. Your children were orderly and showed a respectful attitude.

Your yard is small for so many children and does not have sufficient play room. You might be able to purchase additional playground. Your totlets are in bad repair. There are no pits. Pits should be made in proper fashion and the buildings should be completely repaired. When any improvements are made please confer with Mr. Wilhite as he can help you to secure correct service.

Your school building, basement and heating plant are good. It would be fine if the coat rooms and library could be closed by doors. I congratulate you on having so good a building. There should be a trough eight feet long to carry the waste water away from the well. It is hoped that you can get your yard leveled down and set in grass this summer.

You have done well in furnishing needed supplies for which I commend you. You need two sets of supplementary readers for the children of the first three grades. Your general library is small. Some work materials for the children of the lower grades are needed.

When these few essential improvements are made to the satisfaction of Mr. Wilhite, we shall be pleased to designate yours as a Standard School by the Department of Public Instruction, State of Illinois, if you are interested in the matter.

These suggestions are made to the end that your children may have the best possible opportunities in their efforts to secure an education.

Based on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Spring Creek School, District #129, Macoupin County made March 17, 1939 we conclude that the following sanitary defects exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water seepage which may enter through cracks that can develop in the brick well lining; dust, rain, and dog contamination that may be washed under the pump base and into the well; rain, waste pumpage, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well around the edges of the flush manhole and cover; contaminated waste pumpage which will saturate the ground surrounding the well and which may re-enter it.
- b) The privies are of the approved sanitary pit type but are insanitary at present because the lids in the girls' privy have been removed from their hinges and the urinal in the boys' privy is closged.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present well liming to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Pirections for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 2. Grout a short iron pipe sleeve into the platform so that the end will extend about one inch into the pump as shown is Fig.6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 3. Reconstruct the flush manhole and cover so that the manhole will be surrounded by a two inch concrete curb, and the cover will be of concrete with overhanging sides, as shown in Fig. 5 page 11 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 4. Provide a substantial water tight trough 15 feet in length to carry waste pumpage away from the immediate vicinity of the well.
- 5. Sterilize the well water after the above improvements have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 15 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.

- 6. Provide the girls' privy with hinged, self-closing lide. These lide when closed should fit so as to exclude flies.
- 7. Repair the urinal so that contents will readily flow into the seepage pit.

Since the school afficials are responsible for the protection of the pupils while at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.

If the engineers of this department can be of service in connection with your water supply or sewerage problems, we shall be pleased to be so advised.

We shall appreciate an acknowledgement of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.

This analysis indicates that the water was contaminated and was not safe to drink at the time the sample was collected.

The well appears to be subject to contamination caused by shallow ground water and rain seeping through the upper portion of the well lining. Also dust, dog and bird contamination may be washed under the pump base and through the manhole into the well. Therefore, we recommend that the well be reconstructed as follows:

- 1. Pour a six-inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of 8 feet, or remove the old lining and build a proper form in which to pour the concrete. (See bulletin.)
- 2. Build a new reinforced concrete platform, inserting an iron pipe sleeve in the concrete, underneath the pump base and extending into the pump base at least an inch, as illustrated in the bulletin.
- 3. After the above repairs are made the well should be sterilized with chlorinated lime as outlined on page 11 of our bulletin on wells.

Unless these improvements are made the well cannot be considered a satisfactory source of drinking water.

In the case of school wells where there is considerable waste pumpage, a pipe or concrete gutter should be provided to carry waste water to a distance of 12 or 15 feet from the well before discharging it upon the surface of the ground.

CONCERNING THIS SANITARY ANALYSIS

The statements on the reverse side are based not only on the analytical results, but also on the description of the source as furnished by you or already on file in this office. It is further recommended as follows:

- (a) If the water is unsafe to drink, abandon the supply for one of known safety or bring the water to a boil before use, until the suggested improvements have made the supply safe.
 - (b) If the source is not satisfactory, make the suggested improvements immediately.
 - (c) If the water is safe, take care to keep it safe by protecting the supply from contamination.

A laboratory examination of the water has been made to show the presence or absence of waste matter of human or animal origin. If the water is contaminated by surface wash or sewage, then parasitic intestinal worms, amelic cysts or germs of intestinal diseases, such as cause bowel complaint, diarrhea, dysentery or typhoid fever, may be present in the water, thus endangering the health of persons drinking the water. The analytical terms and results are briefly explained as follows:

Physical and Chemical Tests: "Sediment" through "Chloride." A desirable water has an attractive appearance (no sediment or turbidity) and has no objectionable odor or taste. Chemical results are given in parts per million.

Bacteriological Tests: "Bacteria per ml." indicates the number of microgranisms present in one milliliter (ml.) of water (20 drops). The result reported gives the number of bacteria which will grow at body temperature (87°C or 98°F). These bacteria may not be of intestinal origin and therefore may not be of sanitary importance. Occasionally the test plates are overcrowded so that no bacterial count can be obtained. In such case the report shows "Innumerable" indicating more than 1000 bacteria per ml.

"Bacteria of the colon group" "Presumptive" "Confirmatory Tests": A water containing bacteria of intestinal origin (colon bacteria), if placed in a sugar broth (lactose), will cause fermentation and production of gas in 24 or 48 hrs. By means of further laboratory tests the presence of these bacteria in 10 ml. portions is indicated by a +, their absence by a —. The numeral preceding the sign shows the number of portions giving that result.

Example: 2+3— indicates that two 10 ml. portions of the sample did show and three portions did not show colon bacteria present.

After receipt of the sample in the laboratory it requires from two to five days to complete the sanitary analysis.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS MAY 27TH, 1930

The Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois, met at the residence of John Daley, in said School District, on Tuesday, May 27, 1930.

On roll call the following members were present:President, Jasper Gray, Secretary, John Daley, and Members.

President, Jasper Gray, stated that the meeting was a special meeting called for the purpose of considering the proposition to all a special election to authorize the issuing of bonds to build a new school house in School District, Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine.

The following Resolution was introduced by President Gray, who moved its adoption:-

*RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUING OF BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF BUILDING A SCHOOL HOUSE IN SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT, NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

25 THAT WHEREAS The school house in School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine was destroyed by fire during the year \$\frac{1929}{2}\$;-

AND WHEREAS The Board of Directors of said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, at a special election for that purpose, duly called and held on the 29th day of October 1929, the question of building a new school house for said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine was submitted to the legal voters of said School District, the said proposition being submitted to the legal voters of said School District at the said election in the following form, to-wit:-

"Shall the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois be authorized to build a school house on the site of the former school house in said School District."

AND WHEREAS at the said election, so held in School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine on October 29, 1929, the said proposition to authorize the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine to build a school house on the site of the former school house in School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois, received a majority of all the votes cast in favor thereof, there haveing been votes cast, at the said election, "YES" or for the said proposition, and there having been votes cast NO" or against the said proposition and there having been legal voters of said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine voted at the said election:-

AND WHEREAS as a result of the said election the said proposition authorizing the Board of Directors of said School District to build a school house in said School District was carried and the returns of said election were properly filed with Hugh R. Ganey, the treasurer of said School District, as required by law;-

AND WHEREAS at the same school election there was also submitted to the legal voters of said School District a proposition to borrow money and issue bonds to the amount of Sixty Five Hundred Dollars (\$5500.00) for the purpose of building a school house in said School District;—

AND WHEREAS at the stad election legal voters of said School District voted "FOR" the proposition to borrow money and issue bonds of said School District for the purpose of building a school house therein, and legal voters of said School District voted "AGAINIST" the said proposition;-

AND WHEREAS at the said election of said School District, the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds was not carried and the Board of Directors af said School District were not authorized to borrow money and issue bonds in the sum of Sixty Five Hundred Dollars for the purpose of building a school house in said School District;-

AND WHEREAS the returns of said election, on the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds, were duly filed in the office Hugh R. Ganey, the treasurer, as required by law;-

AND WHEREAS at a subsequent election, duly called and held in said School District on the 28th day of December 1929, the proposition to borrow money and issue bonds in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars for the purpose of building a school house in said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine was again submitted to the legal voters of said School District and at the said election Seven legal voters of said School District having voted "FOR" the said proposition and Twenty One legal voters of said School District having voted "AGAINST" the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds in the sum of Six Thousand Dollars, there having been Twenty Eight legal voters of said School District voting at the said election;—

AND WHEREAS at the said election held December 28th, 1929, the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds in the sum of Six Thousand Dollars was not carried and the results of said election having been duly filed in the office of Hugh R. Ganey, the treasurer, as required by law:-

AND WHEREAS it is now considered, by the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois, that another special election should be duly called and held in the said School District and that at the said special election the proposition to borrow money and issue bonds for the purpose of building a school house in the said school district should again be submitted to the legal voters of said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois:-

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY NINE, MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS That there is hereby called a special election to be held at the residence of John Daley, in School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, on Saturday the Seventh day of June A.D. 1930, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine the

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proposition of borrowing money and issuing bonds of said School District in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars for the purpose of building a school house in School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That at the said special election to be so called and held on June 7, 1930, there shall be submitted to the legal voters the proposition to borrow money and issue bonds of said School District and that the said proposition shall be submitted at the said election to the legal voters in substantially the following form, to-wit:-

FOR

Against

"The proposition to borrow money and issue bonds to the amount of Four Thousand Dollars bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable annually, by School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois, for the purpose of building a school house in said School District, said bonds to mature and to be due and payable as follows: Bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1932; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1933; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1934; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1935; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1936; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1937; bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1938: bonds to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars to mature and to be due and payable on the first day of June 1939. The interest on said bonds to be payable annually on the first day of June each year until all of the said bonds and the interest thereon have fallen due and have been paid."

That the legal voters of said School District shall be given and opportunity at the said election to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds for the puppose of building a school house in the said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the polls of the said election shall be opened at two o'clock P. M. of said day and closed at five o'clock P. M. of said day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the Clerk of the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause notices of said election to be properly posted for at least ten day prior to the said election as is required by law, and that the Clerk be and he is further authorized and directed to have ballots printed and to provide pobl books, tally sheets, a ballot box, and make all necessary supplies and material and all necessary provision and arrangements for holding the said election on Saturday, the Seventh day of June 1930.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That after the holding of the said election the returns thereof shall be canvassed and filed with the treasurer as required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That in case the said proposition to borrow money and issue bonds shall carry at the said election and a majority of the legal voters of said School District vote in favor thereof, that the president of the Board of Directors be and he is hereby authorized and directed to call a special meeting of the Board of Directors after the said election to make arrangements for proceeding with the proposition to issue bonds and borrow money for the purpose of building a school house in the said School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That a copy of this resolution be incorporated in the minutes of the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, Macoupin County, Illinois."

The motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Member Daley and after discussion the question being called for the following members yoted "AYE" Grayfahd Daley.

The following voted "NAY" None

Whereupon the president declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted and directed the Clerk to give proper notices and make all all arangements and provisions for holding the said election in accordance with the terms of the foregoing resolution.

It was moved by Member Daley that the Board of Directors of School District Numbered One Hundred Twenty Nine, do now adjourn. Motion seconded by Gray. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.
