How to Classify Your School in the Classification Register.

1st. Read the course of study carefully; notice the number of grades and the work that each grade includes.

2d. Ascertain in which grade of the Course each pupil has most of his work, and classify him in that grade. If he has not all of his studies in this grade, mark the grade in which such other studies are found, under the headings for these respective studies. (See sample form in Register.)

3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

•

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Oertificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.

2d. Ascertain in which grade of the Course each pupil has *most* of his work, and classify him in that grade. If he has not all of his studies in this grade, mark the grade in which such other studies are found, under the headings for these respective studies.

(See sample form in Register.)

3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to

the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The *first* classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just *finished*.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.



Dear Sire:

October 29th, in company with County Superintendent Wilhite, a very brief inspection of your elementary schools was made. We did not have time to visit the small building.

In no case did we find the rooms over crowded. This has brought about quite a change over the conditions of several years ago. A small teacher load has made it possible for a higher standard of work.

A band has been organized; a teacher of music has been provided. It is a splendid thing to provide for music and to make it possible for the organization of orchestras and bands.

It seemed to me that band practice made quite a good deal of noise. So much so that I could not help but feel that it interfered with the progress of the school. I do not know how this matter could be remedied since you are occupying all the available space for classrooms. But the board of education and the superintendent may find some solution of the problem.

I was pleased to note that there is a library of more than 500 volumes. The books are of the inexpensive type but if properly used will help the school to a very great extent. In addition to these library books there should be sets of supplementary readers for each of the grades from one to six. This question was discussed with your superintendent.

I did not ask your superintendent how many of his teachers attended school last summer. I hope the great majority of them did because there is nothing that will help a school so much as an improvement of the teaching force.

I wish to commend the coard of education and Superintendent Burgess for any and all improvements of the elementary schools of Benld.

These analyses indicate that the water from the well behind the high school was free from dangerous contamination at the time the sample was collected. Water from the nearby well supplying the grade school was contaminated and was not safe for drinking.

Because the grade school well is definitely subject to surface contamination it is difficult to determine whether or not it is also subject to seepage from sewer lines from the two buildings. Information on the construction and location of these sewers and the outlet from the septic tank was not given and we can, therefore, make no recommendations at the present for the grade school well nor can we approve of the high school well.

If you can furnish us with this information we shall be glad to give you our opinion on the safety of the water from these two wells.

It is our understanding that Benld will soon have a public water supply of assured safety and we recommend that as soon as it is available it be used for all water requirements of your public schools.

The analysis indicates that this water was contaminated and was not safe to drink when the sample was collected.

Because this well is located in a built-up section, it is subject to serious pollution from sewers, drains, privy vaults and abandoned sink holes or wells used as cesspools. When pollution from these sources reaches the ground water level, it travels more rapidly and for considerable distances. This well, therefore, cannot be made a safe source of drinking water even if reconstructed.

According to our records the public water supply is safe for drinking and because it is available to this property we recommend that the well be abandoned and filled in with clean earth or clay and that city water alone be used for drinking and culinary purposes.

This analysis indicates that the water was contaminated and was not safe to drink at the time the sample was collected.

In order to yield a safe water, a well must be properly located and must be constructed so that it will be impossible for rain, waste pumpage, surface or shallow ground water to convey contamination into the well.

If the dug well is not located as described on page 2 of our bulletin, it would be useless to attempt to rebuild it. In that case, we recommend the construction of a new well at a safe distance from all possible sources of pollution.

If the location of the well is satisfactory, it should be rebuilt so as to exclude contamination by surface or shallow ground water in accordance with the instructions given on pages 4, 5 and 6 of the bulletin. Special attention should be given to the construction of the wall and platform and to the use of a pipe sleeve. The well should then be sterilized with calcium hypochlorite (chlorinated lime) as outlined on page 11.

Unless these improvements are made the well cannot be considered a satisfactory source of drinking water.

OPINION ON SANITARY QUALITY

The statements on the reverse side are based not only on the analytical results, but also on the description of the source as furnished by you or already on file in this office.

- (a) If the water is unsafe to drink, the supply should be abandoned for one of known safety or the water brought to a boil before use until the suggested changes or improvements have been made.
 - (b) If the source is not satisfactory, the improvements suggested should be made immediately.
 - (c) If the water is safe, care should be exercised to protect the supply from contamination.

BRIEF EXPLANATION OF ANALYTICAL RESULTS

A laboratory examination of the water has been made to show the presence of waste matter of human or animal origin. If the water is contaminated by surface wash or sewage, parasitic intestinal worms or germs of intestinal diseases, such as cause bowel complaint, diarrhea, dysentery or typhoid fever, may be present in the water, thus endangering the health of persons drinking the water.

Physical and Chemical Tests: "Sediment" through "Chloride." A desirable water has an attractive appearance (no sediment or turbidity) and has no objectionable odor or taster Chemical results are given in parts per million.

Bacteriological Tests: "Bacteria per mi," indicates the number of microorganisms present in one cubic milliliter (ml.) of water (one-fourth of a teaspoonful). The results at 37° C (98° F, body temperature) show only that portion of the total organisms which will grow at body temperature. These bacteria may or may not be of intestinal origin. and the property

"Bacteria of the colon group:" "Presumptive Test." A water containing bacteria of intestinal origin, if placed in a sugar broth (lactose), will cause fermentation and production of gas. The presence of these bacteria in 10 ml. portions is indicated by a + if gas in considerable amounts is produced, or by a ? if in only small amounts. If no gas is produced, indicated by a —, these bacteria are absent. The numeral preceding the sign shows the number of portions on which the test is made.

A + under the "Confirmatory Tests," indicates that intestinal of sewage organisms are present. Example: 2+3- indicates that two 10 ml. portions of the sample did show and three portions did not show B. coli present. mer such to com beasene.
