
Butler #155 (A) Right: Picuture taken in Jan 1984.




Below: Pictured in 1987-88 Second Butler School Water Pump and School Grounds.

Treasurers Office Worden, Ill. Special meeting of Board of Trustees. All members present, Larch, Nessel and Moritz.

Petition to sell old school house of District No.2 (Known as Butler School) Filed December 22nd 1887. On motion of Mr Moritz seconded by Nessel it was carried to sell the old school house on the 22nd day of February 1888, for cash to the highest bidder: Said house is a frame house about the size of 16 X 20 feet, and about 9 or 10 feet to ceiling.

A motion to adjorn carried - Dated this 28th day of January 1888

1st. Butler School Reunion

As a gr. granddaughter of Edmund Butler, I am pleased to be able to represent his family at a reunion of Butler School pupils. I love to talk about Butler Family Genealogy, but I won't bore you with a lot of details.

Edmund Butler and his wife, Permelia Ann, came to IL as newly weds from NC about. /\$33 when he was 26 years old, obtained land grants for two adjoining 40 acre plots in sections 16 and 21 in 1836. That was the year his father wrote him a letter verifying that he was born May 8, 1807--we still have that 150 year old tattered letter with the father's signature. The school house was located in the north east corner of the land EDmund owned in section 16. (financing for rural schools)

The Butlers had 7 children--all born in IL. My grandfather, Henry H., first married Lucy Ann Weeks, dau of Lancaster, but she died young--they only had two girls. One of them married Willie Bond and lived a few miles from old D Camp mine. Henry's second marriage was with Mary Jane Piper, my grandmotheramd among their children was my father Oliver Butler. Henry's sister, Eliza, also married a Weeks-bro. bro. cf Lucy who was William Robert, but I know nothing about that family. If some of you belong to the any Weeks family I would be very interested in talking to you.

Edmund died in 1853--rather young, but Permelia lived until 1892--forty years d_{ied} 1906 Harry Scheenweg owned longer than her husband. I assume that it was after she that Louis Klein acquired the farm, passed it on to his son, Edgar, who sola it to Weisemans, present owners.

There are no descendants in the area bearing the Butler name, but several females of the line live in Staunton and have passed it on to their children--I can think of only four such family groups. However, 300-400 of the descendants are broadly scattered throughout southern II and the west.

Judy Klein Sherfy has been very helpful in supplying more recent information about this area so I want to thank her, and to thank Frances for breaking a rule of "pupils and teachers mostly" and allowing me to join you today. In case you wonder, I was born and raised in Staunton and still live there just south of the school, very close to the Kleins. By the way, I am a retired school teacher.
