2d. Ascertain in which grade of the Course each pupil has most of his work, and classify him in that grade. If he has not all of his studies in this grade, mark the grade in which such other studies are found, under the headings for these respective studies. (See sample form in Register.)

3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to

the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just *finished*.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.

1st. Read the course of study carefully; notice the number of grades and the work that each grade includes.

Ascertain in which grade of the Course each pupil has most of his work, and classify him in that grade. If he has not all of his studies in this grade, mark the grade in which such other studies are found, under the headings for these respective studies.

(See sample form in Register.)

3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The 'Syllabus of Classes' shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to

the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which

he has just finished. 7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive

from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing o' opinion by successive teachers.

roday your County Superintendent Mr. Wilhite and I visited your school. I was pleased to see your school and to meet your teachers. It seems that much of the work is starting in very good order.

I make the following suggestions:

- (1) Your opening to the well should be a concrete cover that would not allow a drop of water to enter the well.
- (2) The inside of your rooms is very good except the areas of broken plaster.
- (3) The floor should be thoroughly cleaned and treated with a thin covering of light colored floor oil to retain the fine color of the wood.
- (4) The teachers of the first three grades need two sets of supplementary readers for the children of those grades as they cannot do satisfactory work without them. I hope you may get the Pupils Reading Circle books for your children this year as they would get much pleasure and information out of them.
- (5) Your library is small but it will soon be satisfactory if you add the Pupils Reading Cirole Books and a few other worthy books annually.
- (6) It would be fine if you could have seat work books for reading for the children of the first three grades.

When you make improvements or purchase supplies please confer with Mr. Wilhite as he can do much to help you to secure correct service.

These suggestions are made to the end that your children may have the best possible school privileges.

Dear Mr. Cox:

On January 20, in company with County Superintendent Kerstein, I visited your school. I have the following report to make, which I hope will serve as a guide to you in the further improvement of your school.

You have a good building which has been kept in a good state of repair. It is unfortunate that the building is constructed in such a way that in some of the rooms most of the light comes from the right of the pupils instead of the left. I was pleased to note the new floor upstairs, and to learn that you expect to floor the lower rooms next summer. In order to take good care of these floors it would be wise to provide a strip of concrete walk in front of the school building and to get a large steel door mat.

This school rates high enough to merit Recognition, but there are certain deficiencies in equipment which should be attended to as soon as possible. In fact, these must be provided if the school is to have its Recognition renewed next year. The items are as follows: Bulletin board; library table with chairs in each room not already provided with one; storage cabinet in each room not already provided with one; new maps; good pictures for the walls; Reading Circle books; and supplementary readers for the first four grades. It is reported that you are planning to order these supplementary readers. A school of this size should have a hectograph or duplicator.

It is also expected that since this school has no parent-teacher association or similar organization, you will hold at least four meetings a year of a public rolations type. The requirement for this year will be satisfied by holding two meetings during the second semester. In a few days you will receive a Certificate of Recognition good for the school year 1936-37.

Gentlenen:

I visited the Sawyerville School on the third of March. You have an excellent set of teachers. I think they are doing a very efficient piece of work, and I hope that it will be rossible for you to keep them in your school, as it is fficult to secure good teachers. Even if you have to raise their salaries in order to keep them, it would be much better than to take a chance on now teachers.

I want to congratulate you upon the interest you have taken in your school. You have a very good plant, and I hope that it won't be long before your enrollment increases, so that you can have another teacher, as three grades to a teacher make a heavy teaching load.

There are a few things I would like to mention that I hope you can take care of as soon as you got the necessary funds. The first is your library. It is in pretty bad shape in all of the rolms. I hope that you can buy the Pupils Reading Circle books from the State Reading Circle Board at once, as your children need books to read. If you did not buy them last year, perhaps you can buy both sets this year. They should be purchased each year, as they are the cheapest and best books that you can buy. You also need a half dozen book-size dictionaries for the upper grades. A set of physiology charts are also necessary for the teaching of health.

The following are secondary items which you should keep in mind:—a radio, phonograph, first aid hit, fire extinguisher, pictures, new shades, and fluorescent lamps. The money that you spend for renting a moving picture machine might be used for buying a machine for your school on the installment plan, and in a new years you would own your own machine. The pictures could be rented from the University of Illinois and other places at a low cost.

If the floors are cleaned, and then scaled and wixed, they will stand up a lot better and also help the appearance of the room. The walls should be redecorated. Perhaps you should use an oil paint in place of the calcimine, which is peeling off and looks rather untidy.
