

Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.
4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every

class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classifica-

tion left by their predecessors without good reason. 6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.





Gentlemen:

On September 13 I visited your school at Upper Springdale. Hrs. Marie Maximer is a capable teacher and is doing a nice piece of tork for you.

Please let me congratulate you upon the efforts you have made to keep your school on the recognized list.

I should like to make a few suggestions. Then I was in your schoolroom, the day was rather cloudy and rainy outside and the inside of the
building was almost dark. The children had to sit near the windows to be
able to see what they were reading or trying to write. I see no reason
why you should have all of the trees on the south side of the building to
shut off the light. Therefore, I think it would be better to remove them
as you do not have school in the summer months and the eyes of the children
are north more than the beauty of the grove surrounding the schoolhouse.

The drinking fountain should be repaired. Also, towels should be supplied. You have one large dictionary but there should be at least two or three small textbook size dictionaries, which you can get from a book store or your teacher can order them. The shades in your building are blue and will not permit any light to enter. They are also old and pretty well worn. If you buy new shades, the state recommends a buff color which will permit some light to enter, or else buy some Venetian blinds. The latter, of course, are much more expensive.

Your library has not been kept up to date. I suggest that you go on record to have your clerk order the state approved children's Reading Circle books each year for each one of your schools. This not only cives you the best books at the lowest possible price, but it keeps your library up to date. Rural children have just as such right to the best library books as do city children, and the only access they have to good books is through the ones that you, as school board nembers, buy for them. I am sure that the boys and girls of your school will be happy if you order these new Reading Circle books every year.

You have practically no playground equipment. However, this is not as essential as getting good library books in the school and removing the trees so that it will be lighter in the schoolhouse.

Gentlemen:

On September 13, I visited your school at Lower Springdale. Mrs. Evaling Ferrando is a beginning teacher, but she is very enthusiastic about her work. I believe that she will make an excellent teacher.

Mrs. Ferrando said that she had no daily register. Therefore, we are mailing her one today and charging same against your account. You are also in need of a new flag, first aid supplies, broom and a few other items.

You also need buff shades at this school. However, the light inside of the room is very much better than at the upper school. The only advantage in having the buff shades is that, whon the shades are pulled down, it does not shut off the light altogether as do the blue shades.

It appears that one of your students in this school might need glasses. If the parents of this child do not have the money to buy them, it is within the law for you to provide them. Your teacher will know about this case.

Again, I want to emphasize the necessity of the children's Reading Circle books in this school, too. The new globe which you bought is very good, in fact, better than most schools have. Also, the painting of the building is an added attraction.

Based on an inspection of the centary fecilities at Springfale School. Matrict \$157 Macoupin County, made Farch 17, 1039 we conclude that the following penithry defects exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by midllow ground water scenare which may enter through creeks that can develop in the bribk well lining; rain, waste purpage, dust, bird and dog contamination which may onter the well through cracks in and around the boards which support the pump; duct, bird and dog contamination that may enter the well through the outside openings in the pump base; contribated waste number which will seturate the ground surrounding the wall and which may re-enter it.
- b) The privios are incentiary as they are accessible to flies. insects and redenta because of the open-back type of vaulte, the unprotected oncoings in the seats and woults.
- c) He uriand has been provided in the boys' privy with the result that the boys urinate directly ento the privy floor.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school. we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinferred concrete wall around the outside of the present well living to a depth of at locat 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shows on make 6 of the enclosed bulletia.
- D. Reconstruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete wish extending beyond the walls at least one foot in all directions. A short from Tipe sleave, whose districtor will allow the passage of the purp cylinder. should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. Sleeve should extend about one inch into the purp base. The purp should rest directly on the concrete and be firsty bolted in clace. This is shown in Fig. 6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- J. Replace the present gurp with a purp having a one piece circular been, and a stuffing box currounding the num red.
- 4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to carry waste purpode away from the insedicte vicinity of the well.

- 5. Sterilize the well water after the above improvements have been rade and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 6. Soul the open-back on the vauly so that they will be absolutely flytight. This can be done by placing a tight fitting wood cover over the back and then backfilling with earth.
- 7. Seel the unprotected openings in the seats and vanite so that the vanits will be flytight.
- 6. Provide the boys' privy with a unital. A substantial unital outside the privy and behind the screen will suterially aid in mintaining a clean privy. The unital should be lined with a non-corrective setal and should drain into a separate seepage pit filled with broken stone or gravel, and be devered with earth.

After completing the above recommentations (pertaining to the mater supply), the mater quality may be checked by sending a supple to the laboratory of the State Department of Public Bealth at Springfield. The cample must be collected in a cterile bettle by the laboratory. When writing to the State Payartment of Public Bealth for a container, please mention that remains have been made as recommended. There is no charge for the analysis other than the cost of mailing the container.

Since the school officials are responsible for the protection of the pupils' while at school, it is important that the above recommendations he fulfilled.

If the sugmeers of this department can be of service in connection with your water supply or esserage problems, we shall be pleased to be an advised.

We shall appreciate as acknowledgement of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.

This analysis indicates that the water was contaminated and not safe for drinking et the time of collection of the sample.

Since the well appears to be properly constructed it is quite likely that contamination shown in this sample results from pollutional material introduced into the well during construction. The bricks in the walls of the well may be holding contamination which is leaking into the well. Or paint or oil on the pump or suction pipe may account for the pollution. Possibly the original disinfection of the well following completion of construction was not sufficient to neutralize such contemination.

Therefore, it is recommended that the well be disinfected again with a strong solution of chlorinated lime using at least four pounds of the chlorinated lime, and following instructions given on pages 25 to 25 of the well bulletin, a copy of which is being sent to you today under separate cover. The walls of the well should be thoroughly washed down with this chlorinated line solution and the solution allowed to remain in the well for at least three days. The well should then be pumped out until the taste of chlorine has disappeared. If you will notify us another sample will be collected for analysis.

In the meantime all water from this well should be boiled for 5 minutes before being used for drinking or culinary purposes.

If we may be of further assistance to you in connection with the disinfection of this well please notify us. The District Senitary Engineer may be able to be present when this work is done if you will notify us at our Carlinville office of the date when the work is to be done.

It is likely that new bricks used in constructing the lower part of the well liming contain contamination which is leaching into the water. Or the upper concrete lining may be holding contemination. The recent disinfection of the walls with a solution of chlorinated lime may not have been entirely effective in neutralizing such contamination because of the short period of contact of the solution with the well lining.

It is suggested that the water in this well be continuously disinfected with a chlorinated lime solution for a few weeks in order to make the water assuredly safe for drinking. About two ounces of chlorinated lime should be used for making the solution which can be introduced into the well through the manhole opening. The pump should be operated a few times in order to mix the solution with the water. If a slight taste of chlorine is not present in the water after 24 hours an additional small amount of chlorinated lime should be added until a chlorine taste is noticed. After a few days as the chlorine taste begins to disappear more chlorinated lime should be added in order to maintain a slight taste of chlorine in the water. This process should be continued for several weeks. The chlorine taste in the water is an indication that the water is safe to arink. Instructions for such chlorination will be found on pages 24 - 25 of our well bulletin, a copy of which you now have.

After a few weeks of this treatment another sample should be collected for analysis. If you


