When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should be a complete should be a compl show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

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4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column, of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the.

most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which he

has just finished. In making your recommendations in the section at right of "Pages Canvassed this Term," be just. This section classifies this school for your successor. Make no recommendations that you would not folow scrupulously were you to continue work in this school next term.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents are valuable helps and may be obtained from the County Superintendent.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.

The following will assist you in making your Report accurately:

Total Number of Days of Absence—This will be the sum of the days of absence of all pupils enrolled during the term. Do not count the days a pupil was "dropped" as "days of absence." When a pupil is "dropped" he is not a member of your school and hence cannot be considered as "absent" in the sense in which the word "absent" is here used.

Absence that is less than half a day will be reported as a half day's absence; for example, if a pupil comes before the close of the forenoon recess, count him tardy only; but if he should not arrive until after the forenoon recess, count him absent a half day. Observe the same rule for the afternoon

Total Number of Days of Attendance—This will be the sum of the days of attendance of all pupils en-rolled during the term. The total number of days of attendance, plus the total number days of absence, should ALWAYS equal the total number days of membership. This fact will enable you to test the accuracy of your results.

Average Daily Attendance—This is found by dividing the total days of attendance by the number of days taught. Always express the quotient as a whole number. A fraction that is less than a half should be dropped, but a fraction that is a half or more should be called 1.

Number Violating Compulsors Attendance

Number Violating Compulsory Attendance Law— The law requires all pupils between the ages of seven and sixteen to attend school regularly at least twenty-four consecutive weeks. It does not apply to pu-

pils who live more than two miles from school.

Rased on an inspection of the sanitary facilities of Pleasant Ridge School. District F189, Massayin County made May 3, 1939 to conclude that the following schitzer defects exist:

a) The well is emblact to contamination by shallow ground water someto which way enter through cracks that can devolop in the brick well liming; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be maked into the well through cracks in the collit-base pump; contaminated waste pumpage which will saturate the ground surrounding the well and which may re-enter it; dust, rain, and dog contamination that may be weshed under the pump base and into the well; dirt, musts pumpage, sto that may soop or much into the well through cracks in the platform;

In order to correct these scaling defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinferred constate wall around the entitle of the present well liming to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are above on page 6 of the enclosed buildtin.
- 3. Reconstruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete clab extending beyond the wells at least one foot in all directions. A chart from pipe above, whose discrete will allow the passage of the purp explicator, should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. Bloove should extend about one inch into the purp base. The purp should reat directly on the concrete and be firstly bolted in place as shown in Fig. 6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- G. Replace the callb-base purp with a purp having a one piece circular base, and a stuffing box surrounding the purp red.
- 4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 16 feet in length to carry weste pumpage away from the incediate vicinity of the well.
- 5. Starilize the wall water after the above improvements have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for attribution is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.

At the time of inspection it was noted that the privies were not equipped with drain boards. While this is not a conitary defect at present, the constant dripping of rain from the privy roofs will in time wash the earth round may from the pit and allow the entrance of flies and redents. In order to maintain the present effectiveness of those privies, we suggest that drain beards be installed as shown on the employed passiblet.

It was likewise noted that the lid in the boys' privy was booked up. The lide are made to be self-closing and should be allowed to se fraction.

The old privies should be removed and the pite should be firsty bredsfilled with earth. As they stand they still present a hysaid to handle transmission of disease through flies which have cone in contact with the contants of the pit.

Since the school officials are responsible for the protection of the mails while at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.

If the engineers of this department can be of service in connection with your rater stryly or severage problems, we shall be pleased to be so adviced.

We shall appreciate an admostodyment of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.
