This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

bth. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. *Certificates of Promotion* and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.



To Directors, Eagerville School District #175, Hacoupin County, Illinois.

Dear Sirs:

Today your County Superintendent Mr. Wilhite and I visited your school. Your teachers are interested in the work and are making a good effort to render service. The children were industrious and attentive.

I make these suggestions:

- (1) I commend you for having a water system and inside drinking fountains. I regret that you do not have good inside toilet rooms for both boys and girls. The pressure tank and the water system are already installed.
- (2) Your floors are too dark. It may be that the floors were not well cleaned before they were oiled or that the oil was too dark.
- (3) The green color on the walls does much damage to the decoration. It would be much better if you had used the same color below the blackboards as is used above them.
- (4) The teacher of the first three grades needs two sets of supple entary readers as she cannot do the proper teaching of reading without them. I regret that you do not have the Pupils Reading Circle books as your children would get much pleasure and information out of them. Your library is small but it will soon be satisfactory if you add the Pupils Reading Circle Books and a few other worthy books annually.
- (5) I commend you for having reference books and other supplies needed by the teachers in serving your children.

When you make improvements or purchase supplies please confer with Mr. Wilhite as he can do much to help you to secure correct service.

These suggestions are made to the end that your children may have the best possible school privileges.

To Directors, Magerville School District #175. Macoupin County, Illinois.

Dear Girs:

Today your County Superintendent Mr. Wilhite and I visited your school. I was pleased to see your school. I am certain that the children are interested and that they are doing very good work. The teachers give satisfactory leadership.

I know that you have seen some hard times but when good times have returned I am hoping that you may make needed improvements and additions. Your school is greatly in need of walks to make the outside conditions good. I make these suggestions:

1. The floors are very dark. They should be thoroughly cleaned and then treated with a thin covering of some light colored floor oil.

2. The lower part of your decoration is too dark. It makes the rooms gloomy. There should be no greens or browns. The light color should extend to the base board. The woodwork should be painted a much lighter color.
3. There is need of cabinet space to contain books, work

materials and supplies. Suggestions were made to Mr. Williams.

Your teacher needs two sets of supplementary readers for the children of the first three grades as she cannot do the best teaching of reading without them.

5. Your library is small but it will soon be satisfactory if you buy the Pupils Reading Circle books and a few other worthy books annually.

I commend you for furnishing reference books, work books, Reading Circle books and other supplies needed by the teachers in serving your children.

When you make improvements or purchase supplies please confer with Mr. Wilhite as he can help you to secure correct service.

These suggestions are made to the end that your children may have the best possible school privileges.
