3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.



To the Directors, Washington School, District No. 18, Macoupin County, Illinois.

Dear Sirsi

Yesterday your County Superintendent Mr. Wilhite and I visited your school. Your school was progressing very nicely. The young man is interested and does very good teaching. The children were orderly and industrious. I confidently expect a good year's work from your school.

I wish to call your attention to the following:

- (1) The well platform should be repaired so that waste water will not go into the well.
  - (2) The latch to the inside door should be repaired.
- (3) A shelf for the dinner palls should be put in both the boys and girls coat rooms. Your teacher was instructed in this matter.
  - (4) Your teacher was also instructed about gathering up materials about the school house and premises that serve no use in conducting the school.
  - (5) Your library is small but if you add the Pupils' Reading Circle books and a few other worthy books annually it will soon be quite satisfactory.
  - (6) In a short while you may be in need of more shelf and cabinet room to contain books, work materials, and supplies. Cabinet room is necessary so that the teacher may do good housekeeping.

You have recently done much to improve your school. Both your teacher and your County Superintendent assured me that you would be willing to comply with the very reasonable suggestions made herein. As a consequence I beg to inform you that your school is hereby designated as a Standard School by the Department of Public Instruction, State of Illinois.

When you make improvements or purchase supplies please confer with Mr. Wilhite as he can aid you in securing correct service.

These suggestions are made to the end that your children may have the best possible opportunities in their efforts to secure an education.

Gentlemen:

On December 3 I visited the Washington School, District 18. Mrs. Lens Fite is an exmellent teacher. I hope that you will be able to keep her in your school for a number of years. The boys and girls are very studious and seem interested in their work. You have one of the best schools in Macoupin County from the standpoint of meeting the needs of the community and being well equipped. I want to congratulate you upon the interest you take in keeping your school up in such good shape.

I might mention, however, that a drinking fountain for use indoors during bad weather would be a big help. Also, a few booksise dictionaries for older students to have on their desks are not only convenient but very practical. A set of physiology charts for use in health classes is also necessary. A bulletin board for construction and display work would be very useful and it would preserve the walls. The well platform should be made airtight, so that no surface pollutions can enter. Your maps and globe are old. However, it might be best to wait until the war is over and world conditions are a little more stable before you buy a new one. You have good floors, but they should be recleaned, then sealed, vary nished and waxed, or just a transparent varnish and wax would be sufficient as I believe you had them scaled once before. This will make it easier to keep them clean and also make them look more homelike. The basement would look more attractive if you whitewashed it or painted it white with some kind of water paint such as calcimine, or something on that order. I hope you can get another radio for your school as they are very useful in school work. The music project which you are carrying on is excellent. The small additional cost involved, I am sure, is easily offset by the results obtained.

Centlemen:

Mased on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Washington School, District \$18, Macoupin County made April 13, 1939 we conclude that the following sanitary defects exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water seepage which may enter through cracks that can develop in the brick well lining; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be washed into the well through cracks in the split-base pump; dust, rain, and dog contamination that may be washed under the pump base and into the well.
- b) The privies are insanitary as they are accessible to flies, insects and redents because of the unprotected openings in the seats and vaults, the unscreened vents, the nem-self closing lids, the opening in the vault around the urinal trough.
  - c) The priviou are in poor structural condition.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinforced concrete well around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 2. Reconstruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete slab extending beyond the walls at least one foot in all directions. A short iron pipe sleeve, whose disseter will allow the passage of the pump cylinder, should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. Sleeve should extend about one inch into the pump base. The pump should rest directly on the concrete and be firmly belted in place. his is shown in Fig. 6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 3. Replace the split-hase pump with a pump having a one piece circular base, and a stuffing box surrounding the pump rod.
- 4. Storilize the well water after the above improvements have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.

- 5. Seal the unprotected openings in the seats and vaults so that the vaults will be flytight.
- 6. Provide the privies with hinged, self-closing lids. These lids when closed should fit so as to exclude flies.
- 7. Screen the vents with 16 mesh copper screen wire to prevent the entrance of flies.
- 8. Seal the opening in the vault at the entrance of the urinal trough. The urinal should grain into a separate secrage pit filled with broken stone or gravel. This pit should be covered with earth.

In view of the poor condition of the privies and the number of improvements necessary to make them sanitary, we suggest that the Board of Directors consider the installation of the "Sanitary Pit" privy. This type of privy has many advantages over other types of privies, the principal advantage being the prevention of disease by fly transmission.

It was noted that a common arisking cup was available at the well. The use of a common cup is a serious factor in the spread of disease, from mouth to mouth of its users. The drinking cup should be an absulutely personal article, and as individual to its owner as the tooth brush. We therefore suggest that each pupil have his or her own cup and that they be so stored that they can be used by none other than the owner. No cup should be allowed to hang at the well as this invites its common use.

Since the school officials are responsible for the protection of the pupils' while at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.

If the engineers of this department can be of service in connection with your water supply or sewerage problems, we shall be pleased to be so salvised.

We shall appreciate an admowledgement of this letter and information regarding the action taken toward following the above recommendations.
