This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the close of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.





Gontlemen:

Based on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Ball School. Dist. \$3. Mecompin County made June 16, 1938 we conclude that the following sanitary defeats exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water seepage which may enter through cracks that can develop in the brief well lining; rain, waste purpage, dust, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well through cracks in and around the boards which support the pump; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be meshed into the well through cracks in the split-base pump; contaminated waste pumpage which will saturate the ground surrounding the well and which may re-enter it.
- b) I he privies are insunitary as they are accessible to flies, insects and redents because of the open cracks in the write, the absence of lide in the boy's privy, the non-self elective lide in the girl's privy, the unsured condition in the privies are in poor structural condition.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 2. Becometruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete elab extending beyond the walls at least one foot in all directions. A chart iron pipe shows, whose diameter will allow the passage of the group cylinder, should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. These should extend should one inch into the group base. The group should rest directly on the concrete and be firely bolto in place. This is shown in Fig.C of the enclosed bulletin.
- 5. Replace the split-base pump with a pump having a one piece circular base. If considered economical, the directors may choose to have the split-bare relief together so that their will be no eventage in the base.
- 4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to carry waste purpose owny from the involvate vicinity of the well.
- 5. Sterilize the well enter after the above improvements have been rade not before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.

- 5. Seal the open gracks in the vanits oo that they will be flytight.
- 7. Provide the privies with hinged, self-closing lide. These lide when closed should fit so as to exclude flies.
- 8. Screen the vents with 16 mesh copper screen wire to prevent the ontrance of flies.
 - 9. Repair the broken vents so that they are flytight.

In view of the poor condition of the privies and the musber of improvemonte necessary to make them sanitary, we suggest that the Board of Directors consider the installation of the "Sanitary Pit" privy. This type of privy has many advantages over other types of privies, the principal advantage being the prevention of disease by fly transmission. For a limited persod, These privios can be obtained through a W.P.A. project in Macorpin County. cost to the admol district being the cost of material, and handing. Mr. Virbel Molon is in charge of this project, and further information my be had by addressing him at Box 77. Bilwood, 111.

This analysis indicates that the water was contaminated and was not safe to drink at the time the sample was collected.

The well appears to be subject to contamination caused by shallow ground water and rain seeping through the upper portion of the well lining. Also dust, dog and bird contamination may be washed under the pump base and through the manhole into the well. Therefore, we recommend that the well be reconstructed as follows:

- Pour a six-inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of 8 feet, or remove the old lining and build a proper form in which to pour the concrete. (See Bulletin.)
- Build a new reinforced concrete platform, inserting an iron pipe sleeve in the concrete, underneath the pump base and extending into the pump base at least an inch, as illustrated in the bulletin.
- After the above repairs are made the well should be sterilized with chlorinated lime as outlined on page 11 of our bulletin on wells.

Unless these improvements are made the well cannot be considered a satisfactory source of drinking water.

This analysis indicates that the water was contaminated and not safe for drinking at the time the sample was collected.

Our inspection revealed that this well is apparently properly protected against entrance of contamination. However, it is possible that the recent disinfection of the well with chlorinated lime solution did not completely neutralize all contamination introduced into the well during reconstruction. Oil or paint inside the pump or suction pipe could possibly account for this pollution. It is sometimes necessary to disinfect a well several times before such contamination is entirely destroyed.

We recommend, therefore, that the well be thoroughly re-disinfected with chlorinated lime solution as outlined in the enclosed leaflet. A strong solution of the chlorinated lime should be introduced into the man-hole and the walls and lower side of the concrete slab should be thoroughly washed down with this solution. Sufficient water should be used with the solution to make certain that this has been done. The pump should be operated two or three times at intervals of one hour in order to disinfect the inside of the pump. After the solution has been allowed to stand in the well over-night the well should be pumped out until the taste of chlorine disappears.

If you will notify us after this has been done ar angements will be made for collecting another sample. In the meantime, it is suggested that use of water from this well be temporarily discontinued or that all water be boiled for 5 minutes before use for drinking purposes.
