#### Gentlemen:

I visited the Shiloh School, District #40, on the seventh of January. Your teacher, Mrs. Olive Vaughan, is very capable and efficient. I hope you will be able to raise her salary so that she will stay with you several years.

I want to congratulate you upon the interest you have taken in your school to keep it on the recognized list. On the whole, it meets the needs of your community very well. However, there are a few suggestions which I would like to make. As soon as you can afford it, I hope you will put in electric lights and an indoor drinking fountain. The latter would prove very useful during bad weather. The seats should be placed on boards, so that they could be moved about in the building. The floors should be sanded, then sealed and waxed. This would make it much easier to keep them clean. A first aid kit would help, and a fire extinguisher might come in handy some time. Then too, I think you should plan to put on a new roof, and decorate the interior of the building. A few good pictures would help in the decorating of the room.

You need a new set of maps, but I think it would be best to wait until the war is over before purchasing them. However, you should get a few book-size dictionaries as soon as possible.

#### Centlemen:

Based on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Shiloh School, District \$40 Macoupin County made March 21, 1939 we conclude that the following sanitary desects exist:

- a) The well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water scepage which may enterthrough cracks that can develop in the brick well lining; rain, waste purpage, dust, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well through cracks in and around the boards which export the pump; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be washed into the well through cracks in the split-base pump; contaminated waste pumpage which will saturate the ground surroundin; the well and which may re-enter it.
- b) The privies are installary as they are accessible to flies, insects and redente because of the open-back type of vaults, the unprotected openings in the seats and vaults, the unscreened vents, the absence of lids.

In order to correct these canitary defects at the school, we recorrend the following improvements:

- 1. Pure a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the outside of the present wall liming to a depth of at least 3 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- S. Reconstruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete slab extending beyond the walls at least one foot in all directions. A sport from pipe sleeve, whose diameter will allow the passage of the pump cylinder, should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. Sleeve should extend about one inch into the pump base. The pump should rost directly on the concrete and be firstly bolted in place as shown in Fig. 5 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 5. Replace the split-base pump with a rump having a one piece circular base, and a stuffing box surrounding the pump rod.
- 4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to carry waste pumpage away from the immediate vicinity of the well.

- 5. Sterilize the well water after the above recommendations have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 6. Seal the open-back on the waults so that they will be absolutely flytight. This can be done by placing a tight fitting wood cover over the back and then backfilling with earth.
- 7. Seal the unprotected openings in the seats and vaulte so that the vaults will be flytight.
  - 8. Royair the vents on that they are firtight.
- 2. Provide the privies with hinged, self-closing lide. These lide when closed should fit so as to exclude flies.

The common drinking cup should be removed as it is a factor in the spread of disease by contact with the lips and souths of its various users. Each pupil should have his or her own firialing cup and this individuality be an strictly maintained as in the case of other personal articles such as the tooth brush, comb, and others.

Since the school officials are responsible for the protection of the pupils' while at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.

If the engineers of this department was be of service in connection with your water supply or severage problems, we shall be aleased to be so advised.
