Average Daily Attendance—This is found by dividing the total days of attendance by the number of days taught. Always express the quotient as a

Number Violating Compulsory Attendance Law—The law requires all pupils between the ages of seven and sixteen to attend school regularly at least twenty-four consecutive weeks. It does not apply to me.
