1st. Read the course of study carefully; notice the number of grades and the work that each grade includes.

2d. Ascertain in which grade of the Course each pupil has most of his work, and classify him in that grade. If he has not all of his studies in this grade, mark the grade in which such other studies are found, under the headings for these respective studies. (See sample form in Register.)

3d. When a pupil has completed a study and passed a satisfactory examination, credit him with it in the column of "Studies Completed this Term," also record it in the "Record of Studies Completed," in the back part of the Register. This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.

6th. The classification as left by each teacher should show the status of each pupil at the *close* of each term each being classified in the grade which he has just finished.

7th. A pupil changing from one school to any other in which this Register is used, may receive from his teacher a certificate of his standing, which will enable the teacher whose school he enters to classify him without examination.

8th. Certificates of Promotion and Monthly Reports to Parents may be found to be valuable helps.

9th. Be just and fair in your markings, neither too high nor too low, so as to avoid clashing of opinion by successive teachers.



Centlemen:

On September 28 I visited the Goshen School, District 61. Your teacher, Miss Mary Lou Dowland, is inexperienced and does not have any college work. However, I believe she will make you an excellent teacher. She is very much interested in the children and they seem to like her.

You are to be congratulated on the way you have kept up your school and for keeping it on the recognised list. There are several suggestions which I should like to make. You should have a flag and flag pole; also, a water fountain and paper cups for use inside during bad weather. Paper towels and scap are also necessary. Your teacher should have a hectograph and a work table and chairs for the small children and some paste, color crayons and drawing material. You are also in need of a new bookcase as your books are in bad shape. Several of them are in boxes and on shelves and they are easily destroyed. Three or four booksise dictionaries are necessary for the older children. The Pupils Reading Circle books, which are recommended by the State Reading Circle Board, should be ordered each year. This not only gives you the best books for each grade, but the cheapest you can buy. The shades are old and are not in working order. New ones should be bought as soon as possible. You are also in need of a new set of maps. However, you may wait with them until the war is over as there will probably be a number of changes. A set of physiology charts could be bought at this time.

The new clockrooms which you had put in are excellent. They are a nice addition to your school. Also, the electric lights are a valuable addition. According to your 1943 claim for state aid you had \$133.49 left with some orders outstanding. Unless you spend your money so that there will not be a difference between the '42 and '43 balance, the State Department will keep this extra money. Therefore, it is to your advantage to spend it for some necessary school equipment each year. You are getting about \$39 more state aid this year than last year. This will give you some extra money. You levy 1.00 for educational purposes but do not have a levy for building purposes. You are allowed .38 for building. Therefore, I suggest you have a levy for building purposes next year. This will give you additional funds so that you will get your school equipment and then you can reduce your taxes.

Contlecons

Based on an inspection of the samitary facilities at Godham School. Dist. fol. Macorpin county sade July 77, 1988 we conclude that the following samitary defects exist:

- o) The well is subject to contamination by similar ground mater seepege which may enter the crocks that can develop in the brick well lining; whin, waste purpose, dust, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well through cracks in and around the bear's which support the purp; that, will each dog contamination that may be maded into the well through cracks in the colit-base purp; contaminated waste purps; which will saturate the ground surrousking the well and which may re-enter it.
- b) The privies are inscritary so they are accompile to flice, insects and redeste because of the unprotected openings in the seats and valits. The non-self closing lide in one privy, the absence of lide in the other privy, the unscreamed vents.
 - c) Two privies are in poor structural condition.

In order to correct these scaling defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Four a 6 inch reinforced concrete wall around the enteride of the present well linky to a depth of at least 8 feet below the europeding around surface. Firstions for such construction are shown on page 6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- O. Recomptract the well platform with a 4 inch concrete slab extending beyond the wells at least one feet in all directions. A short from the slower, where discrete will allow the precape of the grap chinder, where in placed in the platform at the time of construction. Shows should extend whent one inch into the grap base. The grap should rest directly on the concrete and he firstly bolted in place. This is shown in Fig.C of the enclosed belletin.
- 3. Replace the colit-base purp with a purp having a one piece circular base. If considered economical, the directors my choose to have thoughthe base welded together so that there will be no openings in the base.

4. Provide a substantial, water tight trough 15 feet in length to entry weste yearage many from the immediate vicinity of the well.

- 5. Sterilize the well water after the above improvements have been trade and before it is used for drinking purposes. The procedure for sterilization is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 6. Seed the unprotected ependings in the seats and woulds so that the vaults will be firtight.
- 7. Provide the privies with hinged, self-closing lide. Those lide when closed should fit so as to exclude flice.
- 8. Screen the vents with 16 mesh copper screen wire to prevent the entrance of flies.
- 9. Reconstruct the privies so that they will be in good obmetural condition.

In view of the poor condition of the priviou and the number of improvements necessary to make them senitary, we suggest that the Board of Directors consider the installation of the "Sanitary Pit" privy. This type of privy has many advantages over other types of priviou, the principal advantage being the prevention of disease by My transmission. For a limited period, these privies can be obtained through a W.P.A. project in Macoupin County. The only cost to the school district being the cost of material, and hanling. Mr. Virbel F. Molen is in charge of this project, and farther information may be had by addressing him at Box 77. Nilvood. Ill.

Since the school efficials are responsible for the protection of the modils' while at school, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.
