This record should show every study which each pupil completes, until he finishes the course and graduates from the district school. The graduating of classes is one of the greatest incentives that can be used in keeping pupils from "dropping out" of school. Diplomas for graduation will be furnished by the County Superintendent for all pupils who finish the course of study.

4th. The "Syllabus of Classes" shows every class in each study, and the pupils (indicated by numbers) belonging to it, also the pages canvassed by each class during the term. The names of pupils belonging to each class may be found by referring to the names, corresponding to each number, in the column of "Names of Pupils."

5th. The first classification of any school is the most difficult, and should be made with much care. Succeeding teachers should not change the classification left by their predecessors without good reason.



Centlemon:

Based on an inspection of the sanitary facilities at Union School. Dist. 77. Macoupin County made June 16. 1936 we conclude that the following sanitary defects exist:

a) I he well is subject to contamination by shallow ground water sempage which may enter through cracks that can devolop in the brick well lining; rain, waste pumpage, dust, bird and dog contamination which may enter the well through cracks in and around the boards which support the pump; dust, bird and dog contamination that may be washed into the well through cracks in the split-base pump; dust, rain, and dog contamination that mut be washed under the pump base and into the well.

In order to correct these sanitary defects at the school, we recommend the following improvements:

- 1. Pour a 6 inch reinferced concrete wall around the outside of the present well lining to a depth of at least 8 feet below the surrounding ground surface. Directions for such construction are shown on page 8 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 2. Reconstruct the well platform with a 4 inch concrete slab extending beyond the walls at least one feet in all directions. A short from pipe sleeve, whose dismeter will allow the passage of the pump cylinder, should be placed in the platform at the time of construction. Sleeve should extend about one inch into the pump base. The pump should rest directly on the concrete and be firmly belted in place. This is shown in Fig. 6 of the enclosed bulletin.
- 3. Replace the split-base year with a green having a one piece circular base. If considered occurrence, the directors vay choose to have the split-base welded together so that there will be no ependings in the base.
- d. Starilise the well mider after the above improvements have been made and before it is used for drinking purposes. We procedure for attribution is described on pages 16 and 17 of the enclosed bulletin.

Since the school officials are responsible for the protection of the marile while at mchool, it is important that the above recommendations be fulfilled.

Gentlemen:

In response to a letter from the teacher, reporting an unsatisfactory condition of the water supply at the Union School, an inspection of the well was made and Mr. Jess Jennings contacted on peptember 15. A further investigation of the condition of the well was made on September 19, in company with Killian C. Burger, who was Superintendent of the NFA Project under which this well was constructed. We are writing to confirm verbal recommendations made to Fr. Jennings on the latter date.

The investigation of the well revealed two small areas of honeycombed concrete, on the north and west sides of the well lining, at a depth of about six feet below the ground surface. There was no evidence of crumbling of the concrete. It is possible that ground water may be entering the well through the lining at these honeycombed areas. However, it is thought that the well may be satisfactorily protected against entrance of pollution with the ground water because those areas are located six feet below the ground surface. The lining above the six feet depth appeared to be of fairly good concrete.

The disagreeable tasts which was reported by the teacher to be present in the water at the opening of the school term was probably caused by the chlorinated lime which was used for disinfecting the well following completion of the improvements. The foam reported on the water surface was likely from the lime also. The blue color reported in the water may have been caused by suspended particles of clay or it may have been a graenish color which is produced by the chlorine. Taste, odor, color and foam in the water resulting from the use of chlorinated lime are not harmful. The taste of chlorine is an indication that the water is safe for drinking.

Since the manhole has been eyened several times and two men have entered the well recently, contamination has very likely been introduced into the well. Therefore, we recommend that the well be again disinfected with at least two pounts of chlorinated lime, as outlined on pages 23 - 25 of our well bulletin. The concrete well lining and lower face of the platform should be thoroughly washed down with the chlorine solution and the latter allowed to remain in the well for at least 48 hours. The well should then be pumped out several times in order to remove the strong taste of chlorine, after which another sample should be collected for analysis as a check upon the condition of the water.

If you will notify me at our District Office in Carlinville of the date when you plan to disinfect the well I may be able to be present to give you some assistance at that time.

After the well has been disinfected, the manhole cover should not be removed unless absolutely necessary because pollution may enter each time the cover is removed. If it is necessary for a man to enter the well at any time, the well should again be disinfected with chlorinated lime after it has been entered. Wood blocks should not be placed under the edges of the manhole cover because insects are allowed be enter the well if this is done. Some insects were noted in the well at the time of the recent inspection. Ventilation of the well is not necessary.

If we may be of further service to you in connection with this or other sanitation problems, please do not heatate to call upon us.

Gentlemen:

On October 30 I attempted to contact all three members of the Board of Directors of Union School, but was unsuccessful. I wanted to inquire if I may be of service in connection with disinfection of the well at your school. Such disinfection was recommended in our report of analysis of the sample of water collected from the well on September 15, 1942. We believe that a thorough washing down of the walls of the well and disinfection of the water with chlorinated line is advisable, in order to attempt to eliminate the contamination in the well. This was recommended verbally to Mr. Jennings on September 19, 1942. At least two pounds of chlorinated lime should be used for this purpose. Instructions for the chlorination are given on pages 23 - 25 of our well bulletin.

Please notify me by means of the inclosed postal card of the date when the Board of Directors will have the chlorinated lime on hand so that I may be present to give assistance in disinfection of the well. If the well has already been disinfected and the chlorine taste pumped out, please notify me of this fact so that I may collect another sample of water for analysis.

We wish to give you all the assistance possible in removing the contamination from your school well in order that the water may be assuredly safe for drinking. We shall appreciate the return of the inclosed postal card.

Since the manhole cover on this well has been removed several times, two men have entered the well recently, and the well was cleaned and has not been disinfected following the cleaning, it is very likely that contamination shown in this sample was introduced into the well in this manner. Also, insects were noted in the well at the time of the recent inspection. These insects probably entered under the manhole cover which was set on wood

this well may be satisfactorily protected against entrance of surface and ground water contamination as mentioned in our letter of September 22 to the board of Directors. However, the well should be again disinfected with chlorinated lime as outlined in that letter in order to neutralize the contamination which has been introduced into the well.

Fater from this well should not be used for drinking until the disinfection has been completed and a satisfactory analysis obtained.
