

## Complete your required PD hours with an Illinois approved provider

Ensure that PD is from an Illinois approved professional development provider prior to registering, paying, or attending an activity. Not sure if a provider is IL approved? check out a list of Approved Providers on the ISBE website!

### What can I use to fulfill my PD?

- Holding the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification at the time of license renewal will fulfill 60 hours of PD if you are a teacher/school support personnel and will fulfill 40 hours of PD if you are an administrator.
- Holding an Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) or national license fulfills ALL 120 hours of professional development for school support personnel. <u>See more details here</u> under the School Support Personnel header.
- Activities completed through an Illinois <u>approved professional development provider</u> will fulfill varying hours of PD.
- College/University Coursework taken at an Illinois regionally accredited institution of higher education will fulfill
  varying PD hours (1 semester hour = 15 PD hours). Out-of-state coursework can be honored if your district or
  another approved professional development provider approves it by providing you with the ISBE Evidence of
  Completion form (ISBE 77-21B).
- Enter your completed PD hours into your ELIS account and renew your license by paying registration fees prior to the expiration date of your license(s).

Even if you do not owe any PD, you must pay registration fees to renew your license.

## **Professional Development Update from ISBE**

PD Requirements for FY 21 Renewal and Forward:

EDUCATORS IMPORTANT Please remember that beginning with the 2015-2020 renewal cycle, and every cycle thereafter, there are no longer any reductions for licensure renewal professional development hours. Below is the baseline number of professional development hours educators will owe for license renewal, beginning with licenses renewed this spring/summer:

- Licensees Holding National Board for Professional Teachers Certification: 60 hours (if serving in an administrative role, 1 Administrator Academy per year is also required)
- Teachers who are not National Board Certified: 120 hours
- School Support Personnel who are not National Board Certified: 120 hours (School Social Worker - PreK - Age 21, School Counselor - PreK - Age 21, School Psychologist - PreK-Age 21, School Nurse - PreK - Age 21, Speech-Language Pathologist (non-teaching) - PreK - Age 21)
- Administrators who are not National Board Certified: 100 hours + 1 Administrator Academy per fiscal year

There will no longer be any reductions for advanced degrees, National certifications, etc. since these "pre-July 1, 2014" activities, as allowed under 25.800(e) of Administrative Code, were last applicable to FY 20 license renewal.
