The Teachers' Retirement System is holding a large group meeting in your region in Carlinville on Thursday, September 28, 2017 at 4:30 at the Carlinville Primary School.

Retired Educator License Reinstatement

Any licensee who has retired, and whose license has lapsed for failure to renew, may reinstate that license without penalty by providing proof of retirement from a state retirement system to the State Board of Education through Dec. 31, 2017.

Individuals must submit a copy of a letter from a state retirement system (on official agency letterhead) confirming the individual's retirement. The licensee's name, IEIN, and date of birth must be included with the letter. Upon verification that the licensee is not working in a position requiring a professional educator license, the educator's license will be reinstated.

The verification letter will be used in lieu of a \$500 penalty fee or nine semester hours of coursework. Educators will not need to input any owed PD and will not need to pay back or forward registration fees.

ISBE will announce the 2018 Illinois Teacher of the Year during the Those Who Excel banquet on Saturday, Oct. 28, at the Bloomington-Normal Marriott Hotel and Conference Center in Normal. The Teacher of the Year will represent Illinois at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama, and in the Council of Chief State School Officers' National Teacher of the Year Program.

High School CPR Toolkits Available

Lauren's Law, enacted in July 2014, requires that all secondary schools provide training in Bystander CPR and Automated External Defibrillators (AED) education as part of the health education curriculum. The Illinois State Board of Education provides a guidance document on this law, available at www.isbe.net/pdf/schools150801.pdf.

To help schools with the cost and materials necessary to meet this requirement, Illinois Heart Rescue has created High School CPR Toolkits for schools' use. Each toolkit will include 16 stackable and durable mannequins, two AED trainers, educational support materials including key messaging highlights, and reference materials. Each kit also contains a CPR training DVD that is available in five languages.

Regional Offices of Education (ROEs) via the Illinois State Board of Education will house the CPR toolkits. Individual schools will be able to "check out" the CPR High School Toolkits as needed through the ROEs.

The Carlinville ROE has the kits available for check out to all of the schools within our region. Please contact the Carlinville ROE office at 217-854-4016 if you would like to schedule training for your high school students.

Licensure, Plus

Public Act 100-0013 makes a number of changes to the School Code, including:

- Lowers the minimum age for an individual to apply for an educator license to 19.
- Allows individuals who hold a valid CTE license to substitute teach CTE courses.
- Removes the 20-hour coursework requirement for individuals who want to renew a provisional CTE license.
- Provides statutory authority for the Director of Special Education endorsement.
- Applies the Administrator Academy requirement to maintain an active administrator license only to individuals who have worked in an administrative position within the past five years.
- Allows school psychologists to renew their Illinois licenses by providing proof of valid national licensure.

The new law took effect July 1, 2017.

NEW

Cultural Competancy and Racial Bias: 105ILCS 5/10-20.60 -

(all personnel at least once): Effective July 1, 2017, in-service training required for school personnel to include training to develop cultural competency, including understanding and reducing

implicit racial bias, including affective, behavioral, and cognitive bias.

This Academy focuses on a high rate of interrater reliability using the required performance evaluation ratings. Using case studies, the participants will collect evidence and use the Illinois Standards for Principal Evaluation to rate the principals.Participants will use data collected from the case studies and compare the data to best practices for evaluating principals and assistant principals. This data will also be analyzed to prepare administrative and school-level professional development plans.

- Participants will prepare targeted professional development, in a collaborative and supportive way, plans that consider past results and contribute to professional and personal growth. This plan will be aligned to the school improvement plan.
- The instructional environment indicators will be analyzed. The purpose of the evaluation plan will be to communicate the outcomes and findings in such a manner that the principals and assistant principals set goals for improvement. The participants own personal bias will be analyzed while making these decisions.
