


#### Virtual Education Career Fair - Feb 19

# February is Black History Month

Below are a few ideas and resources educators may wish to utilize.

- BlackPast.org offers a wealth of materials, including transcripts of more than 300 speeches by African Americans (and others, speaking on racial topics), more than 140 full text primary documents, plus timelines and gateway pages to digital archives and African and African American muse-



ums. Here's how you can use Blackpast.org in the classroom.

- The <u>Smithsonian's Learning Lab</u> has shared Black history lesson plans for each grade range <u>here</u>.
- For high school students, <u>Teaching Tolerance</u> has posted an <u>online</u> <u>article</u> challenging teachers to expand their lesson plans to allow students to make meaningful connections to current events.
- Also for high school students, <u>Facing History</u> has collected resources and lesson plans <u>here</u> to support educators preparing for Black history month.

Several organizations have created lesson plans based on the amazing Inauguration Day poem by 22-year-old Amanda Gorman, the first person to be named National Youth Poet Laureate and the youngest inaugural poet in U.S. history.

#### **National Board Certification 2021-22**

ROE/ISC #40 is proud to announce we will be a cohort host for teachers and counselors pursuing National Board Certification during the 2021-2022 school year. This cohort will meet 12 times throughout the school year and is led by a trained National Board Certified Teacher who will guide teachers through the process at no cost. Teachers can earn 24 Professional Development clock hours as they complete their National Board components. The state offers a subsidy to pay for all fees associated with becoming a National Board Certified Teacher (there is a one-time \$75 registration fee — this is the only cost an eligible teacher will incur). Apply for the subsidy from March 01, 2021 until May 10, 2021. Cohort support sessions begin statewide in September.



The Illinois State Board of Education announced the \$1,900 National Board Candidate Fee Subsidy Application will be available for Illinois teachers and counselors wishing to begin during the 2021-2022 school year. Funding has been made available for 500 candidates. The subsidy application for teachers pursuing National Board Certification during the 2021-2022 school year is available at March 1 – 10 am and closes at midnight on May 10.

## Arts Education Week March 15—19


