Got a Job? Get a Work Permit! It's the Law. To protect the safety of Illinois teenagers, and place of priority on their education, minors age 14 or 15 may work, b

priority on their education, minors age 14 or 15 may work, but not without first obtaining an Employment Certificate from their local high school or school administration office 820 ILCS 2059/9-12. If you are over 16 the State of Illinois does not require a Work Permit, but your employer may still request one.

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Illinois State Historical Society Olive Foster Outstanding Teacher Award

Do you know an outstanding history or social studies teacher in Illinois? The ISHS Education Committee seeks nominations for the Olive Foster Outstanding Teacher Award. This award honors Olive Foster, former Illinois State Historian, Director of the School Services Program, and originator of the Illinois History Program for students. The annual award is designed to recognize and reward a full-time teacher for outstanding contributions to the study and teaching of state and local history. Recipients of this award actively promote Illinois history in schools as well as in their local communities, using the resources of one or more local historical societies, museums, the ISHS, and other Illinois-based historical organizations. Documentation of the teacher's work is required. A \$1,000 award will be given in 2022 to an Illinois teacher from one of the following categories:

- 1. elementary school level,
- 2. middle/junior high school level, and
- 3. high school level.

The award will be presented at the Illinois State Historical Society's Annual Awards Banquet in 2022.

Illinois State Historical Society Verna Ross Orndorff Scholarship

The Verna Ross Orndorff Scholarship (\$1000) was established in 1989 in honor of River Forest resident Verna Ross Orndorff, a lifelong student of Illinois history, to encourage interest in Abraham Lincoln and the Civil War in Illinois high schools. To apply for the scholarship, essays meeting the following criteria should be submitted (postmarked or emailed) by January 15, 2022:

- The focus of the essay should be on Abraham Lincoln or a significant event in the Civil War period in Illinois;
- Essays should be 1,500 words with a title page, outline, an annotated bibliography and suggestions for further reading.

The Illinois high school student whose research paper is selected will receive a \$1,000 scholarship and a certificate of achievement and will be honored at the Annual Awards Banquet in 2022. The paper will be published in a forthcoming issue of *Illinois Heritage* magazine, the popular history magazine of the Illinois State Historical Society.


