2022 Student Health Physical Fitness Opening Webinar

Please join ISBE for a webinar at 10 a.m. Sept. 16. This webinar will review the School Year 2022 Physical Fitness student health data collection. We will review the online data system and allow time for questions. All Illinois children in Grades 3-12 (only Grades 4-12 for aerobic capacity) must be tested annually. Districts must report aggregate data to ISBE for Grades 5, 7, and 10 only. The data collection will officially open for SY 2022 on Sept. 1, 2021. Districts are required to have their Physical Fitness data approved and submitted to ISBE by June 30, 2022.

Constitution Day - September 17

Friday, September 17, is Constitution Day. This federal observance recognizes the adoption of the United States Constitution and those who have become U.S. citizens. It is commemorated on the day in 1787 that delegates to the Constitutional Convention signed the document in Philadelphia.

#CivicsInTheMiddle classrooms have a plethora of resources available to their classrooms to help mark this occasion. Below, we curated a few for you to start your planning.

- * The National Constitution Center has a series of special events and lesson plans to commemorate the occasion.
- iCivics created lesson plans and activities to commemorate the day with resources specifically for English Language Learners.
- * The Civics Renewal Network curated a Constitution Day Toolkit for your review.
- * <u>The Library of Congress</u> has gathered a number of primary sources and lesson plans to support teachers.
- * Docs Teach from the National Archives has a special page with resources designed to "bring the Constitution to life."
- * Our friends at the Florida Joint Center for Citizenship have gathered a number of activities for K-12 class-rooms.
- * Share My Lesson has PreK-12 Constitution Day activities, lesson plans, and resources.
- * The Center for Civic Education has K-12 grade activities to commemorate the creation and signing of the supreme law of the land and to honor and celebrate the privileges and responsibilities of U.S. citizenship for both native-born and naturalized citizens.
- * The American Bar Association has resources and lesson plans to commemorate the day.
- * The Bill of Rights Institute (BRI) has exciting plans for Constitution Day Live-- a hybrid streaming program featuring direct live engagement with teachers and students coupled with pre-recorded segments and published in-class materials to promote the study of the Constitution and Constitutional issues. In the run-up to the live event, BRI will be releasing several new videos starting September 1 and new lesson plans starting September 7. Ten lucky teachers who sign up will receive gift boxes for themselves and their students with pocket constitutions, gift cards, and other fun and educational BRI swag! BRI will announce winners live on September 17.

Online Courses Available for RNs to Perform Special Education Evaluations

Health assessments and recommendations for health-related goals for students with Individual Education Programs must be provided by a registered nurse (RN) with an ISBE-issued Professional Educator License (PEL) endorsed in school nursing (as written in School Code). The PEL is the legally defined and required School Code credential for school nurses performing any job duties that include student academic evaluations.

Many RNs have completed coursework and internships leading to the PEL, but some districts have tried and been unable to hire a qualified school nurse. Such districts may apply to ISBE to hire and train a non-PEL RN and remain in compliance with special education evaluation rules.

The next online course for RNs in special education is scheduled Oct. 13 (course introduction) through Nov. 29 (includes a break the week of Thanksgiving). Contact School Nurse Consultant Rebecca Doran at rdoran@isbe.net to enroll in these online courses. District administrators or special education directors who need to fill this role may view required documents to be submitted to ISBE for review and may submit questions via email directly to Ms. Doran.

To qualify, juniors and seniors must demonstrate leadership by serving in elected or appointed positions in which they are actively representing a constituency in organizations related to student government, education, public affairs, and community service.

Students must be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents at the time of application to the U.S. Senate Youth Program. State qualified students must be serving in an elected or appointed position in student government or other educational or civic organization representing a constituency of their peers for the entire academic year in which they apply for USSYP.

UNITED STATES SENATE YOUTH PROGRAM HEARST SCHOLARSHIP

For 60 years the United States Senate Youth Hearst Scholarship Program has tapped a vital reservoir of talent from America's high schools. Senator Susan Collins of Maine, Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, the former chief judge of the of the U.S. Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals, a former governor, former ambassadors, presidential advisors and many current and former aides in every branch and level of government are all alumni of the program. Two students will come to Washington, D.C. (or attend a virtual program if required during the pandemic) and learn about government from a perspective few people ever get to see. They will meet their peers from across the nation, be immersed in a premier leadership experience, and receive a \$10,000 college scholarship in the name of the United States Senate.

During Washington Week the students will attend briefings and meetings with several senators, the president of the United States, a justice of the Supreme Court, Cabinet secretaries, and an ambassador to the United States, other federal agency leaders and senior members of the national media. Each speaking event includes a substantial question and answer session allowing the students direct and personal interaction with the high-level leadership. While in D.C., the students also tour national monuments, memorials and historic sites. This in-depth exposure is precisely what fuels and sustains the students' commitment to making a difference in their country, communities and schools.
